This is a great opportunity for our young people to meet with teens from other Coast communities. Please encourage your children, grandchildren, and friends' and neighbors' children to participate in this activity.

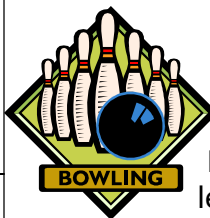


### "Brown Bag Sunday" and the Hancock County Food Pantry

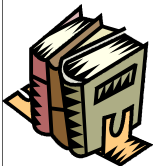
#### Christian Education

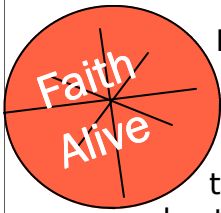

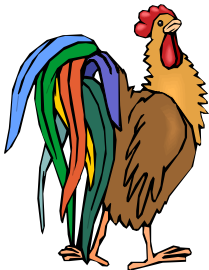

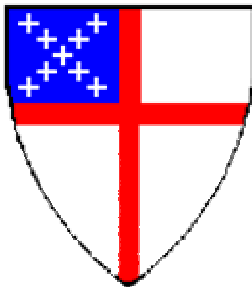
