Lent and Holy Week have passed, the resurrection has been well and truly celebrated, and we have reaffirmed our own faith in eternal life in God's presence. What's next?

We might consider an important part of the post-communion prayer we say just before we sing the recessional hymn and leave church. We collectively ask God to "send us out to do the work you have given us to do, to love and serve you as faithful witnesses of Christ our Lord" (BCP, 366).

These words carry a comforting sense of acceptance. We have just shared Christ's presence at the Lord's Table, and we feel cleansed, uplifted, and renewed. And then we ask God to help us go into the community to serve him in thanksgiving for the spiritual food that we have received.

How do we understand these sacred words at the end of the service? Is there a danger that instead of being a request for God's blessing in our work, they are more like a signal that church is about to end and soon it will be time for coffee and donuts, or whatever else we have planned?

That's not how those words were intended. When we say this prayer we ask God to send us out to serve him and bear witness to his truth. And when we say the prayer we make it our own even though the words were written long ago by someone else in the prayer book.

How do we do the work we are given to do? One of many ways is to be a good neighbor and tell people about St. Thomas. Invite them to church or a church function. Certainly we welcome new people into the church on Sunday as they decide to visit us. That's very important.

But we also are called to take the initiative Monday through Saturday. We are called to reach out to our friends and neighbors. Speak to them about your experiences at St. Thomas. Tell them about some of the interesting things we do here. Let them know what God has done for you.

And I know that sometimes it's harder to talk with our friends about our faith than it is to talk with strangers. Sometimes we are not sure what to say, and so we might have a tendency to hold back.

But I would urge us to do just the opposite. It's really not that hard. We don't need to be theological experts, or have answers to complex religious questions. Simply speak about how St. Thomas has become your spiritual home. Explain how St. Thomas has been a place of comfort for you. Talk about how God has helped you. I think you will find that it feels natural.

Many people are waiting to be asked, and might be hesitant to take that first step. Perhaps the idea of going to church can be intimidating, and they put it off to another time. You can help bring them to St. Thomas and a new life in Christ. And what if people you know are just waiting to be asked, but no one does so? Send us out to do the work you have given us to do.

Prayer Shawl Ministry

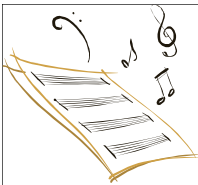

Memorial Garden Update

Our memorial garden is taking shape! The trees and roses we planted were all sponsored by church members within the first week of the announcement of this project. Many thanks to John Boos for sketching the way we want it to look in completion, which excited parishioners to give. We received donated work in excavating the holes from Billy Lamb; the grading of the site and planting of the trees was done by Dick Nolan.

Our next step will be the construction and raising of the cross, which is scheduled for our Spring Clean-Up on April 19. The garden will have an altar, large wooden cross, and benches for small outside worship services. The altar will have our existing columbarium for placing ashes above ground in weatherproof containers, and also accommodate containers of ashes in the ground for those who prefer that new option. There will be opportunities for plaques to be attached to the base of the altar in memory of those who wish to be recognized as members of the church even if their remains are elsewhere.

While all the trees were sponsored at \$150 each, we can accept additional sponsorships to assist in the building of the altar, benches and cross, as well as additional landscaping work to include irrigation and sod.



Clean Up the Church and Put Up the Cross Come Even if you Don't Work

Our annual spring clean-up and repairs of the buildings and grounds will be on Sunday April 19, the week after Easter. This year we will have a special celebration to erect the cross in our memorial garden that is under construction. The cross will be behind the altar that will be constructed to house the columbarium. This is an important event, and we eventually will have the Bishop come to dedicate the cross and consecrate the altar. There *will be a single service* at 9:00, a.m. (one service only that day), followed by work, and refreshments offered by the Mens' Breakfast Group. Please come even if just want to observe. Everyone is invited to come and relax, participate in the cross-raising, and enjoy the refreshments.

Johnson Hall Water Bottle-Church Periodical Club

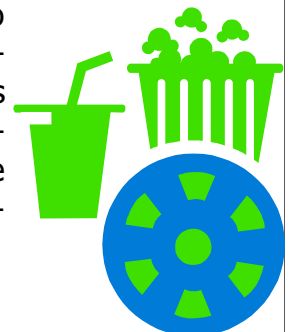
